Chet's wife, Diane, is still alive. They're still married. Chet has made it known to Diane that he is moving into the summer home of his first love and intends to spend as much as of his remaining life as he possibly can with Irene. That may not be so long, as Chet is ailing from disease that is progressively taking a toll on him.

Irene's overprotective daughter, Shelby, is angry that her mother might find comfort in the arms of any man other than her father. Finally, Shelby objects to Chet because he's a right-winger. Meanwhile, Shelby has lost sight of the fact that her own marriage to Alan has begun to erode

"A Short Stay at Carranor" is an affirmation of the enduring power of true love. At the same time, it takes an unblinking look at the harsh realities of making relationships work, and the ending that all of us, especially the old, will surely face.

William Blinn is the playwright. A celebrated writer for television and film, he won Emmy Awards for "Roots" and "Brian's Song," created "Starsky and Hutch," wrote the screenplay for "Purple Rain," wrote or produced for numerous TV series, among them "Eight Is Enough," "Pensacola: Wings of Gold," "Our House," "Fame," "Here Come The Brides," "Hunter," "The Rookies," and so much more. He has been honored with the Peabody Award, the Humanitas Prize, and the Laurel Award for lifetime achievement by the Writers Guild of America.

Lee Meriwether plays Irene. A member of Theatre West since the company's inception, she is also one of its best-known actors. A former Miss America, the still radiantly beautiful performer is an icon of mature glamour. Famed as the first feature film Catwoman, she is also known for her work as a regular on a host of TV shows, among them "Barnaby Jones," "All My Children," "The Time Tunnel," "Mission Impossible," "The Today Show" and much more. Her many previous shows at Theatre West include "Spoon River Anthology," "Nunsense," "Love Letters," "Rockers," "Four Pilots," "Betty Garrett: Closet Songwriter," her solo show, "Women of Spoon River: Their Voices From the Hill," and so much more.
